### Who are we?

The Royal Society of Blind Children (RSBC) works with a national network of partner organisations to deliver relevant and personalised services to blind and partially sighted (vision impaired - VI) young people in England and Wales.

### Aiming higher for children and young people

This project aims:

To work together to promote equality, inclusion, and diversity in terms of access to youth work services in England and Wales and in relation to the youth work services' role in proactively challenging discriminatory attitudes and behaviours within society.



### Free Training Offer!

Participation in the 'Making Your Activities Inclusive' training will enable you to build on your knowledge and skills whilst demonstrating your commitment to supporting and developing the youth work profession.

Individuals from both the voluntary and statutory service sectors across Wales, aged 16+, and working or volunteering in any role within youth work can attend this training session.

For example, you may be a local youth club, provide cultural and arts activities, sports sessions, or any service that welcomes children and young people.

This training is a free, interactive, online, three-hour session where you will gain the knowledge and confidence to include vision impaired children and young people into your provision.



### What will I learn?

You'll learn about common eye conditions, their impact on the individual, and explore the myths around sight loss. You'll gain essential guidance on making your clubs, activities, and sessions VI friendly. There will be an opportunity to gain a practical understanding of adapting virtual and physical activities to make them inclusive to children and young people with sight loss.
