## **PROFESSIONAL TRAINING**

Quarterly online learning sessions for professionals who work with YP.

The content of sessions will be guided by local need as the programme evolves, and include:

- Pornography Awareness
- Exploring Masculinity and Tackling Misogyny
- Teaching Consent and Managing Disclosures of Sexual Harassment

Sessions will provide a space for professionals to network, ask questions and share examples of best practice.

# Understanding Masculinity and Tackling Misogyny

Duration: 3 hours

## Overview of session:

In response to increasing concerns about the dangerous impact of online misogyny on students, Brook has developed this training session to support teachers to understand and tackle harmful misogynistic narratives in the classroom. This training prepares professionals to understand gender related pressures among young people, to know the nature and scale of online misogyny, and to identify and mitigate the push-pull factors that attract young people towards extreme online ideologies. This training includes practical RSE tips and activities to increase professionals' confidence in raising an awareness and tackling misogyny in the classroom.

## Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the training participants will be able to:

- Describe the harm gender stereotypes cause young people of all genders
- Define misogyny and give examples of how it affects young people
- Understand the impact of digital content on young people's gender norms and values
- Recognise and mitigate the push-pull factors that attract young people towards extreme ideologies
- Feel confident in raising young people's awareness of misogyny and tackle harmful ideas in the classroom

# Understanding Masculinity and Tackling Misogyny

Duration: 1.5 hour briefing

## Overview of the session:

This briefing aims to give professionals an introduction to current conversations relating to masculinity and tackling misogyny. This 1.5-hour digital Exploring Masculinity and Tackling Misogyny briefing is open to professionals working with children and young people across Wales.

This briefing aims to provide an overview of how misogyny impacts children and young people in school/youth organisations, and to offer professionals practical activities and approaches to tackling harmful attitudes in the classroom/wider society. The briefing will be presented for 60 minutes, with 30 minutes allowed for questions and answers at the end.

By the end of the training participants will be able to:

# Pornography Awareness

## Overview of session:

This course will enable participants to gain knowledge and skills about the influences and pressures young people face online as they develop and explore their emerging sexuality.

## Learning Outcomes:

By the end of the training participants will have gained knowledge and understanding of:

- The research and laws covering pornography and young people
- The impact of pornography on young people
- How to talk to young people about Pornography
- Research and laws surrounding Youth Produced Sexual Imagery (YPSI)
- The impact of YPSI and Image Based Sexual Abuse on young people
- How to talk to young people about YPSI and Image Based Sexual Abuse
- Government guidance on managing disclosures and responding to incidents of YPSI

# Pornography Awareness

Duration: 1.5 hour briefing

## Overview of the session:

# Teaching Consent and Managing Disclosures of Sexual Harassment

Duration: 3 hours

## Overview of Session:

Professional training for professionals who work with young people and require confidence building in addressing sexual harassment

## Learning Outcomes:

This training aims to equip professionals to be able to:

- Feel confident in managing disclosures related to sexual assault
- Understand the importance of adopting a holistic approach to educating about consent including gender, social norms and bystander approach
- Identify a spiral curriculum approach to teaching consent
- Explore the current context of sexual assault in the UK and learn about the effects of sexual assault
- Understand how to effectively embed the topic of consent within the broader PSHE curriculum

# Teaching Consent and Managing Disclosures of Sexual Harassment

Duration: 1.5 hours

## Overview of session:

This briefing aims to provide an overview of the statutory Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) guidance relating to consent and equip teachers with essential knowledge and strategies for teaching it effectively.

Providing an overview on how to deal with managing disclosures.

- Locate further teaching and signposting resources and understand what support services are available for students
